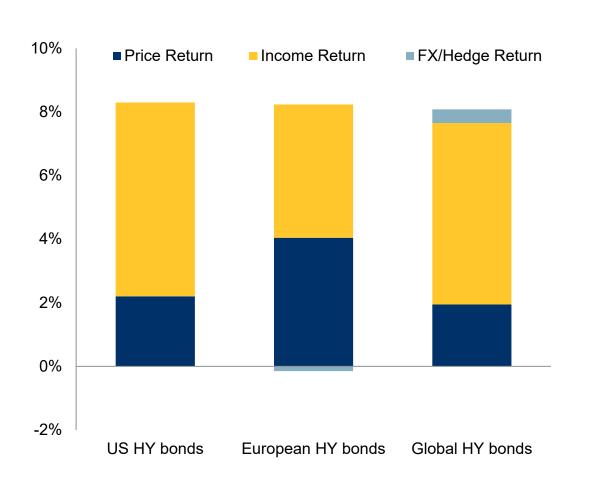

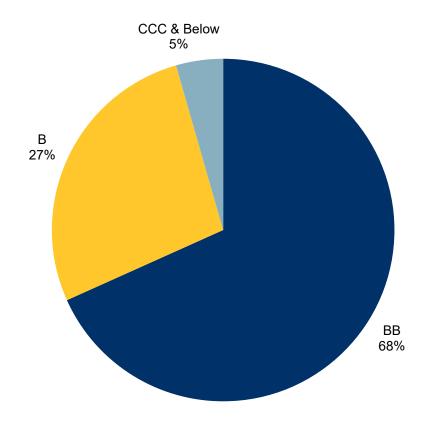

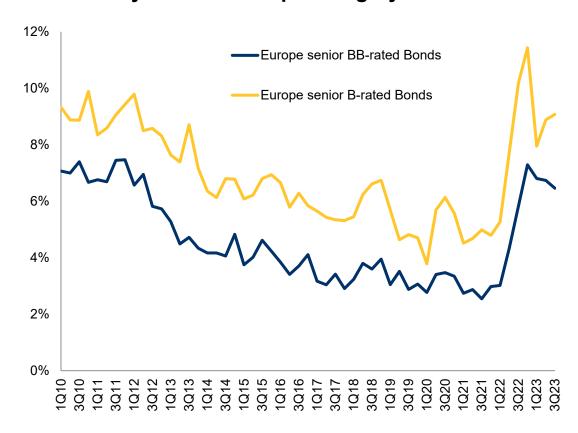


Attractive yields on offer in performing High Yield

New issue yields for European high-yield bonds

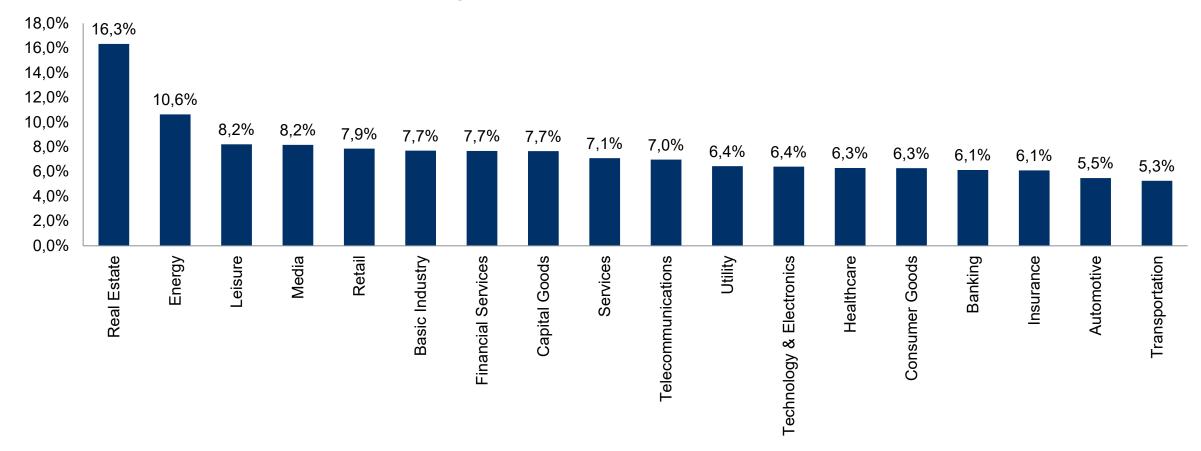

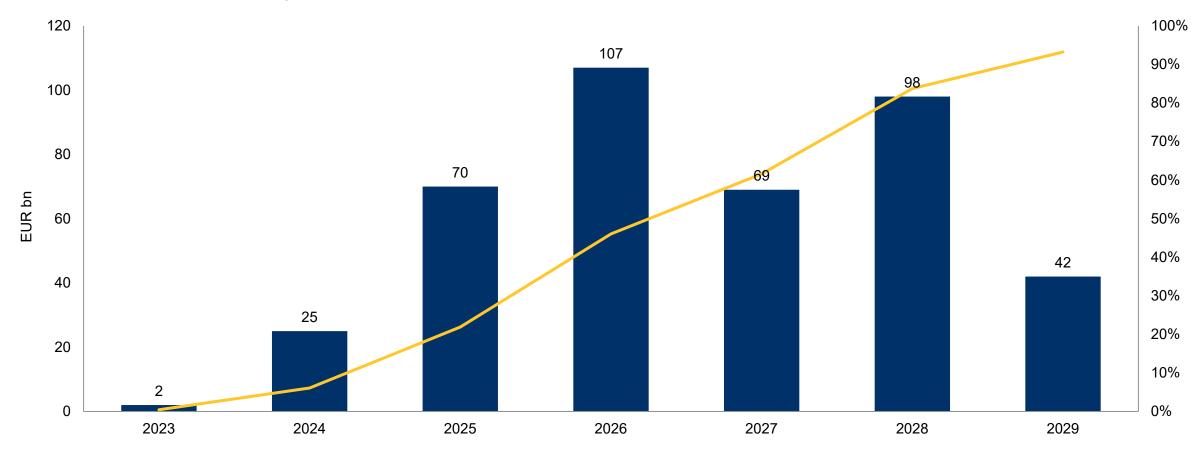

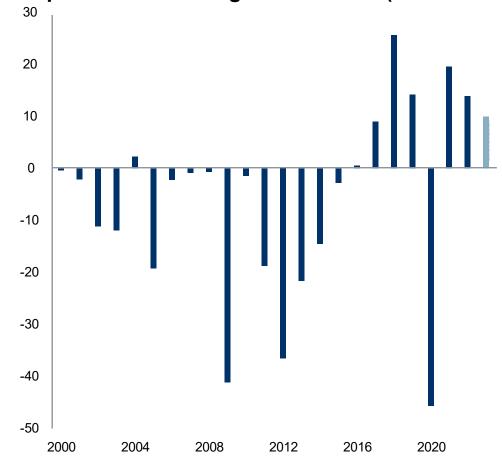

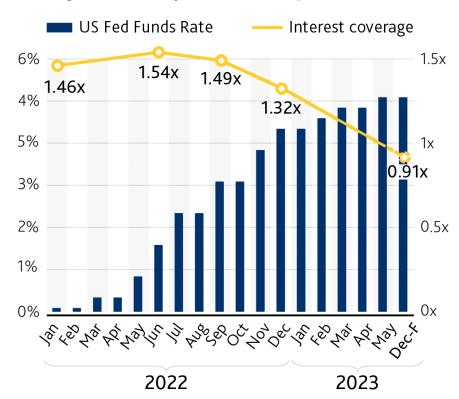

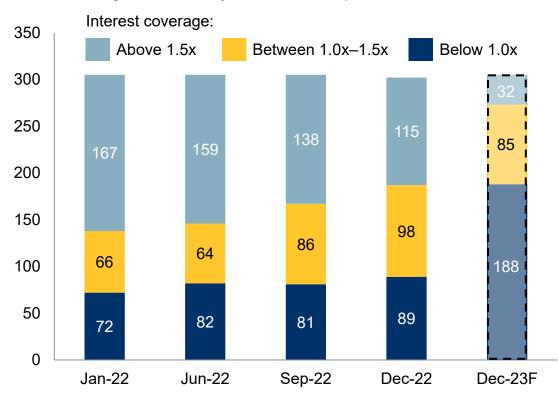
Aggregate interest coverage will fall below 1.0x for B3-rated companies by year end

Interest coverage as defined by EBITDA less capex/interest

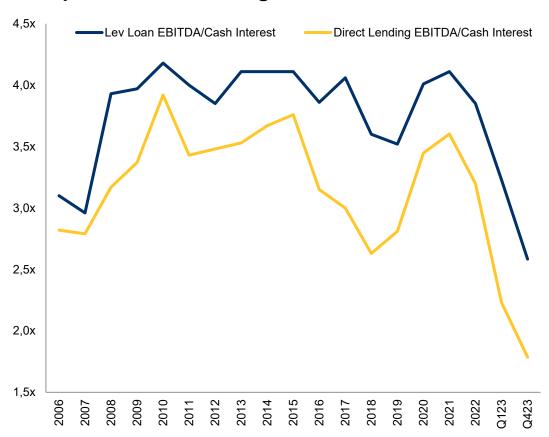

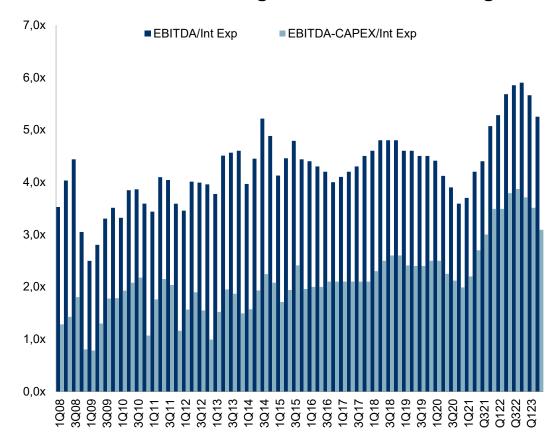


Greatest pain on floating-rate capital structures

... US HY interest coverage remains near the highs



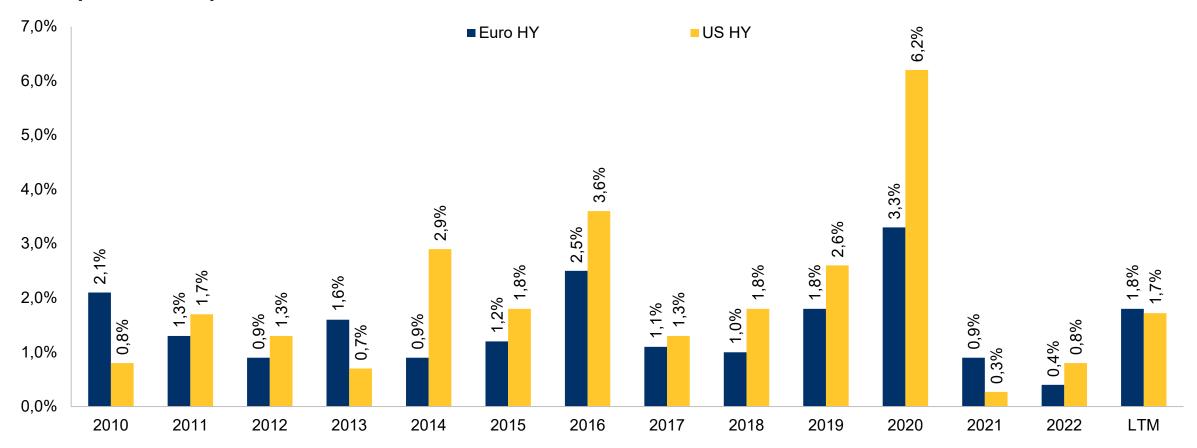

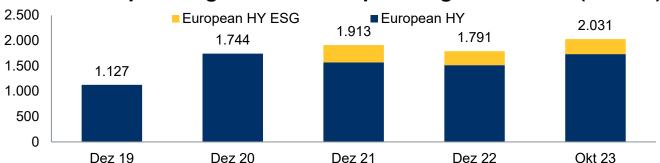

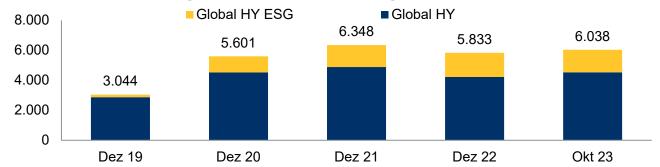

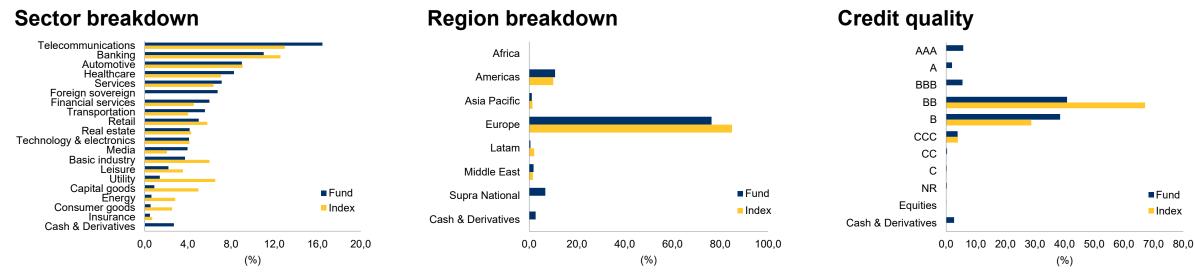

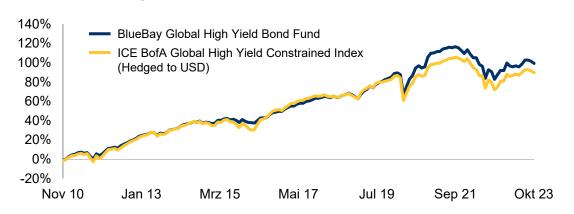

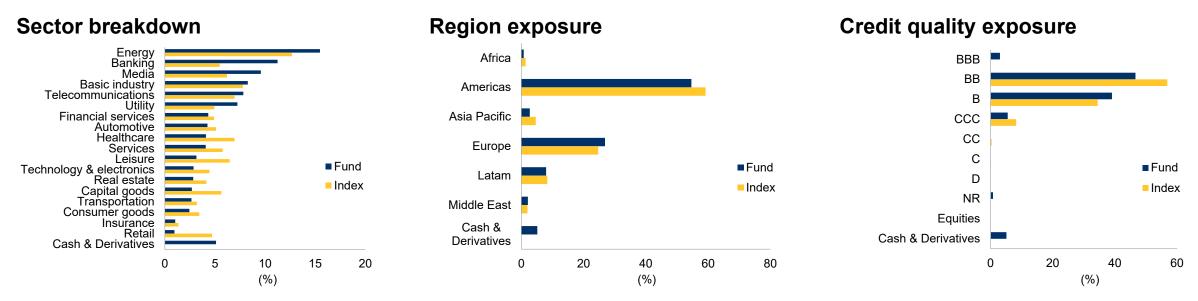

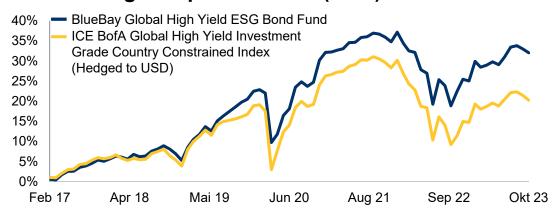

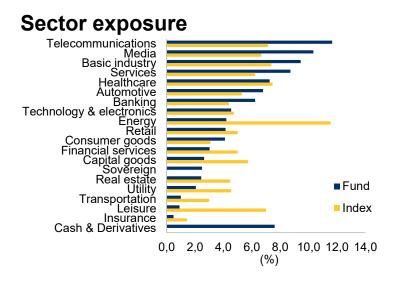

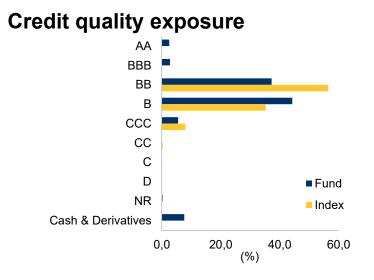
